

THE HOUSE THAT HUGH BUILT

How one donor's generosity will provide a **home away from home** for patients, family members and visiting medical students

In January, Southeast Georgia Health System announced an anonymous donation had been received for the specific purpose of building a new lodging facility on the Brunswick Campus.

Since then, construction has begun and the Health System has revealed its new lodging facility will be named Nunnally House in recognition of the generous gift received from the Hugh Nunnally family, longtime philanthropic supporters of the Health System.

🏠 A WARM, SAFE HAVEN

With an anticipated completion in early 2014, the Nunnally House will serve as short-term residential quarters for the families of critical care patients, cancer patients and their family members, and on-call team members and medical students completing their residencies at the Health System.

Plans include a one-story residential building with three designated living areas: a cancer patient wing with 16 one-bedroom units; a critical care family wing with 12 two-bedroom units; and a wing with 16 one-bedroom and 2 two-bedroom units for medical students and on-call team members.

Located next to the Brunswick Campus on Kemble Avenue, the Nunnally House will offer all the comforts of home, from compact refrigerators and microwaves to handicap-accessible bathrooms with showers. The living areas will also be equipped with dinnerware and other daily essentials, and community laundry facilities will be available.

"This gift gives us the opportunity to further enhance the experience of the people we serve," says Krista Robitz, director, Development, Southeast Georgia Health System Foundation. "It keeps families close to their loved ones while they're being cared for, and that's what's at the heart of this project."

🏠 A HISTORY OF GIVING

The Nunnally House is just one more remarkable philanthropic gift legacy. Mr. Nunnally and his family have supported a variety of charitable initiatives since 1997—most notably a gift in 2007 for the renovation and expansion of what is now known as the Miriam & Hugh Nunnally Maternity Care Center. ➡
