## The Munnally House opens its doors

ince it was first announced last year, the Nunnally House has become a highly anticipated addition to the Southeast Georgia Health System Brunswick Campus. Thanks to the generosity of Hugh Nunnally and his family, the new lodging facility opened its doors in May, providing much needed shortterm residential housing for cancer patients and their family members who travel significant distances to receive treatment; critical patients' family members who are from out of town; medical students completing their clinical rotations at the Health System; and on-call team members.

Located on Kemble Avenue in Brunswick, this one-story residential building includes 40 units.

"The Nunnally House will have a tremendous impact on the lives of our patients receiving cancer treatment and the families of our critically ill patients, as they will no longer have to travel or stay in a hotel while receiving care. They will be just a few steps away," says Krista Robitz, director, Development, Southeast Georgia Health System Foundation.
